


Pastor's Message

In the Book of Revelation, we find a message that is both timeless and profoundly relevant to our lives today. Revelation 1:4-6 opens with a greeting from John to the seven churches in Asia Minor, but it quickly becomes a message of hope, blessing, and a reminder of God's eternal love and purpose for his people.



"Grace and peace to you from him who is, and who was, and who is to come, and from the seven spirits before his throne..." Revelation 1:4 (NIV)

Here, John extends a heartfelt greeting of "grace and peace" to the seven churches. It's a reminder that God's grace and peace are available to us, no matter the challenges we face. While we may see change all around us: the seasonal colors of fall, the young children who just don't seem to be so little anymore, the health that doesn't seem as reliable as before, the mention of God as the One "who is, and who was, and who is to come" assures us of his eternal presence, constant and unchanging.

"...and from Jesus Christ, who is the faithful witness, the firstborn from the dead, and the ruler of the kings of the earth. To him who loves us and has freed us from our sins by his blood..." Revelation 1:5 (NIV)

In this verse, we find a beautiful description of Jesus Christ. He is the "faithful witness," utterly reliable, faithful to his Father in heaven and to his people, even to the point of giving his life. He is the "firstborn from the dead," reminding us of the hope of resurrection and eternal life. He is also the "ruler of the kings of the earth," illustrating his sovereign authority over all creation. Most importantly, we are reminded of his deep love for us and the freedom from sin that his sacrifice on the cross has brought us.

"...and has made us to be a kingdom and priests to serve his God and Father—to him be glory and power for ever and ever! Amen." Revelation 1:6 (NIV)

In this final verse, we are called to reflect on our identity and purpose as believers. We are not merely individuals; we are a "kingdom" united under Christ's rule. We are "priests" entrusted with the sacred duty of drawing closer to God and helping others do the same. This is our high calling—to serve and glorify our Heavenly Father, offering praise and honor to him for all eternity.

As we contemplate Revelation 1:4-6, let us remember that these verses are not just words on a page; they are a source of inspiration, encouragement, and hope. They remind us of God's unchanging love, Christ's redemptive work, and our noble calling as his people. Let's live out this message daily, sharing his grace, peace, and love with the world.

Principal's Report

- Mrs. Johnson attended a workshop on Tuesday, October 3. The topic dealt with the Units of Study curriculum for Reading.
- Mrs. Panzer will be visiting another 4K room at Faith Lutheran School in Fond du Lac on Thursday, October 5.
- The Wisconsin State Teachers Conference will be held on Thursday, October 26, and Friday, October 27, at Wisconsin Lutheran High School. The theme this year will be Let His Work Your Pleasure Be.
- The Parent-Teacher-Friendship held its first quarterly meeting on Tuesday, September 19.
- St. Paul's Lutheran School hosted Grandparents Day on Thursday, September 28. 166 grandparents registered. They joined their grandchildren for chapel and spent the day rotating through various activities. A special thanks goes out to the many volunteers who made this event run smoothly!
- Grades 3K-4th will participate in a Fire Safety event on Wednesday, October 11. The Howards Grove Fire Department will be providing four events for students to practice fire safety.
- The Veterans Day Dinner is scheduled for Thursday, November 9. Plans are already underway.
- The last day of the 1st Quarter is Wednesday, October 25. Report cards will be sent home on Tuesday, October 31. Parent/Teacher Conferences will be held on Thursday, November 2, and Friday, November 3.
- St. Paul's Lutheran School filed its second Friday in September count with the Department of Public Instruction.

School Board Report

First PTF meeting was held. Three requests were approved. (Blinds, Door locks, remaining balance for school books). An informed representative should plan on being present for future requests to be able to answer questions that arise.

A request for tuition assistance was partially approved.

A review of the early childhood wing brought up a discussion of further definitions / specific requirements for children. Discussions are ongoing, figuring out the best policies to implement for the best quality of learning and better managing classes.

School Board members are willing to assist as additional ushers for the Christmas services as available.

Treasurer's Report

Financial Results to Revenue

Offerings for the month of September (4 Sundays) totaled \$68,500 (averaging \$17,100 per week) up from August (4 Sundays), totalled \$64,300 (averaging \$16,100 per week and compared to last year September-2022 (4 Sundays) totaled \$57,100.

\$54,800 in tuition was received in September. 51% of the budgeted K-8 tuition and 50% of the 3K/4K tuition was received in the month. A quarterly School Choice payment of \$74,400 was received this month.

Special donations received in September were:

- We received an additional \$155,000 for Growing Forward.
 - \$430 for Faith for the Future.

<u>Expenses</u>

<u>Church Expenses</u> are under budget as medical expenses and music/worship supplies are running under budget.

<u>School expenses</u> for medical insurance are also under budget. In order to assure continuation of coverage for the Marohn family, we kept them on our insurance for July & August. In September, we were reimbursed by Cornerstone Lutheran. We are seeing higher expenses for textbooks and supplies with the startup of school. These expenses should come in line by the middle of the school year. Moving expenses totaling \$3,831 were paid this month.

<u>Property / shared expenses:</u> property & Casualty insurance is running below budget. With the school expansion we budgeted higher costs but received an adjustment less than planned. We are also seeing lower utility costs so far.

<u>Missions:</u> Monthly payments to WELS and MLHS were made to budgeted amounts. The Net Results of the operating (Budgeted) funds is a (\$3,440) loss, compared to a planned (\$8,219) loss.

Building Expansion:

Some added payments for landscaping totaling \$9,600 were paid in Sept. A final construction bill of \$255,820 will be paid when all issues are settled. Construction borrowing remains at \$2,814,666. With the higher loan balance, interest paid for September was \$10,776. At the end of August, outstanding pledges for Growing Forward stand at \$280,700.

Trustee's Report

We have decided to ask for a substitute custodian to help clean if an emergency arises with any of the current custodians.

It has been decided to try having a physical key to open the locked janitors closets. This key will be located somewhere in the teachers workroom. It will have some sort of object connected to it so that someone cannot stick it in their pocket.

It was discussed that with the increase in workload the Trustees now have with the new building, we will be looking to possibly add one extra board member or two.

Some of the members from the Trustee's took part in the new building training of fire suppression and HVAC. In regard to the new fire pump, we will be getting step by step procedures on how to turn off the pump if there is an accidental activation with no emergency present. For example, someone or something breaks off a sprinkler head.

Evangelism Report

Church Photo Directory -

The final photo session for the directory was completed in September.

Approximately 245 members had their photos taken during the photo sessions.

Members were surveyed as to whether they would like a printed copy or only a digital copy.

Approximately 160 members have requested a printed copy of the church photo directory. Printing by an outside vendor will begin in 1-2 weeks. We hope to have printed photo directories available in late October...

All members will have access to a digital copy of the church photo directory.

Activities Report

Nothing to Report at this time.

Officer's Report

In a recent emergency council meeting the wages for the aides and janitors was increased. We felt it appropriate to review the secretary's compensation in light of these other changes. A recommended increase was agreed upon with an effective date of the beginning of October. Will take it to council for approval.

A member made a request to use the facility for a meeting of a non profit group they belong to. Partial approval was given to the request. A \$150 facility use fee was going to be charged. Decision was brought to the member but they had made other arrangements by that time. This brought to light that we need some facility use request guidelines. Officers will continue to work on this.

Now that our Building Project is near completion, we discussed our future ministry vision. We are looking to have the Long Range Planning Committee create a process to develop a 3 to 5 year plan. Targeting January to unveil this process and start this work.

WELS Report

Board for Home Missions approves tenth new mission start for 2023

Last week the Board for Home Missions met for its fall meetings and approved one new start and four enhancement requests. This brings the total new mission starts this year to 10 (not to mention the approved enhancements), which is on pace with our synod's goal of starting 100 new mission churches and enhancing 75 existing ministries from 2023-2033.

WELS Reports contd

•Buffalo, Wyo. (new start): A group of 27 WELS members living in the Buffalo area have been worshiping weekly in the local civic center since March 2020, led by the pastor from Lord of Lords in Casper, Wyo.

•Mount Calvary, Redding/Anderson, Calif. (enhancement): Home Missions is providing financial support for Mount Calvary, a multi-site ministry, to call a staff minister to assist with evangelism and youth/family ministry at the Anderson site.

•Christ the King, Palm Coast, Fla. (enhancement): Christ the King will receive short-term Home Missions support to call a campus pastor to reach out to the 125 students with no church home at their growing Christ the King Academy.

•Hope, Deerfield, Wis. (unsubsidized): Hope in Deerfield began outreach and worship in fall 2021. Unsubsidized mission status gives them access to grants from Home Missions and WELS Church Extension Fund (WELS CEF) as well as support from their district mission board and mission counselor.

•Cross of Christ, Las Cruces, N.M. (unsubsidized): Cross of Christ started in a member's home 11 years ago. The congregation has 73 members and owns land along a major access road where most of the city's new development is taking place and where hundreds of young families are moving.

As district mission boards and mission counselors are looking for new places to start churches and enhance ministries, WELS members have responded to help support this gospel outreach goal with their offerings. Since starting this initiative, more than 1,500 members have contributed more than \$1.7 million to help launch new home missions. Thanks be to God! Thank you to all those who have contributed toward this effort of boldly taking the gospel to people in new locations throughout the country.
