

COMMUNION

We offer Communion on the 2nd and 4th Sundays/Mondays of each month. God says that Communion is an expression of unity (1 Cor.10:16-17), so we practice close communion. Those who have explored and established unity with us on the basis of God's Word are invited up to the Lord's Table. Please speak to a pastor if you have questions about our practice.

FAMILIES WITH SMALL CHILDREN

There are changing tables located in BOTH the women's and men's school bathrooms near the school. There are children's quiet bags in the narthex. If you use one, please make sure to put it back. Please reserve the back few pews for families with small children. We have a nursery room located just off the narthex. There is a speaker in there so you can still hear and take part in the worship service. Please feel free to use this room for your child(ren), including a place to nurse.



St. Paul's Lutheran Church is a member of the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (The WELS) and was founded in 1862. We have our Lutheran elementary school (4K-grade 8) on site and are part of a federation of churches to support our own high school, Manitowoc Lutheran High School.







11. **CCCW Anniversary Recognition** - On Sunday, June 18th, we recognized the anniversaries of the following staff members:

Dawn Johnson - 35 years- Mrs. Dawn Johnson graduated from Dr. Martin Luther College in 1988, and has been blessed to serve several congregations in a variety of capacities. She began teaching grades 3-5 at St. Paul's, St. James. After Mr. Johnson was assigned in 1990, she began teaching some departmentalized classes, piano, substitute teaching, and covering long-term leaves of absence. She served in this way at Our Savior's, Bylas, AZ; Peridot Mission School, Peridot, AZ; St. John's Dowagiac, MI; Cross of Christ, Coon Rapids, MN; Immanuel (Crown of Life), West St. Paul, MN; Pilgrim Lutheran, Minneapolis, MN; and Timothy Lutheran, St. Louis Park, MN. Mrs. Johnson then resumed full-time ministry in 2000, continuing at Timothy Lutheran, teaching grades 1-2 and departmentalized music. She took a call to Pilgrim Lutheran, Minneapolis, MN, in 2006, to teach Kindergarten, departmentalized art and music. Dawn accepted the call to teach grades 1-2 at St. Paul's, Howards Grove, in 2016, and her husband Greg was called to join the staff in 2017. They both love working with the families at St. Paul's school and being a part of the congregation here in Howards Grove.

Luther Curia - 20 years - Mr. C was called out of Martin Luther College to teach grades 1-4 at St. Paul's School in the fall of 2003, the first year in the new school building. In 2004 St. Paul's added a 1-2 grade teacher to the staff, and Luther taught grades 3-5 for the next several years. When a 5-6 grade teacher was called to serve our growing school, Luther taught grades 3-4. He and his wife, Gillian attended the WELS Worship Conference in 2014 and came back with a strong desire to add musical variety to our worship services. In 2018 Luther was given release time in the afternoons to devote to coordinating special music, adult choir, and worship planning. He was installed as a full-time staff minister in 2020 and serves in the areas of Worship, Bible study, and church activities. While he has served at St. Paul's for all 20 years of his ministry, his role has constantly changed, keeping things fresh. Luther and his family love serving in Howards Grove and are blessed to be part of the St. Paul's family.

Pastor Mueller - 20 years - Pastor Mueller has been an Instructor of Ancient/Medieval History and Government/Current Events at Luther Prep in Watertown. He was a Tutor: dorm supervisor of boys and taught religion to 10th graders at Michigan Lutheran Seminary in Saginaw. In addition to current service at St. Paul's, he also served St. Mark in Eau Claire, and Shepherd of the Hills in Tucson, AZ as pastor.
