





8. Christmas at St. Paul's Reserved Seating: The doors to the gym will be opened 30 minutes before each service begins. There are no reserved seats, except for service volunteers.

9. TOUR the Building Project! On Dec. 17 and 18 we will run several tours for 15-20 minutes for you to see the progress and ask any questions. Quasius will be on hand as well and make these as safe as possible. [Please understand these tours are still weather permitting.] The times each day are 9:15am and 9:45am. 10. Capital Campaign Update: As the final building costs become more clear, we could have a potential mortgage around \$3.1M which is about \$500,000 higher than originally planned. There are still on-going activities to reduce the mortgage, but any additional gifts or pledges will help offset the amount of the mortgage. A generous donor at St. Paul's will match \$.50 on the dollar up to \$65,000. If pledges and gifts are given (above and beyond already pledged amounts) up to \$130,000, we will maximize this gift! (Each dollar gifted then is worth \$1.50.)

Additionally, Kohler accepted our grant request and is gifting all the fixtures, faucets, sinks, toilets, etc. for the project! The list is over 100 products! We thank God for these things and marvel at how he provides.

11. Celtic Christmas Concert: Join us Tuesday, December 20 at 7:00 for a night of music with The Lutheran Ceili Orchestra! Christmas tunes, many of them hundreds of years old, will be played on traditional Irish instruments: guitars, fiddles, drums, harp, cello, tin whistles, uilleann pipes, bagpipes, vocals, and more. The atmosphere of the concert is very casual and follows the ceili format: "an intimate social event at which there is Irish folk music, singing, and storytelling". No two concerts of The Lutheran Ceili Orchestra are the same, as the musicians have lyrics and/or melody lines for each tune and then improvise countermelodies and harmonies. Feel free to come when you can and stay as late as you wish. Free and Open to the Public!

- 12. Christmas Eve Worship:** There are three services on Christmas Eve. The 2:00 & 4:00 services, held in the gym, will be candlelight services, involving several musicians. The 6:30 service will be a simple lessons & carols service in the church, accompanied by piano.
