## COMMUNION

We offer Communion on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of each month as well as those following Monday evenings. Because God says that Communion is an expression of unity (1 Cor.10:16-17), we practice close communion, inviting up to the Lord's Table those who have explored and established unity with us on the basis of God's Word. Please speak to a pastor if you have questions about our practice.

## FAMILIES WITH SMALL CHILDREN

St. Paul's Lutheran Church is a member of the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (The WELS) and was founded in 1862. We have our Lutheran elementary school (4K-grade 8) on site and are part of a federation of churches to support our own high school, Manitowoc Lutheran High School.







### First Reading

*Acts 11:1–18*

*Peter's mission work in Caesarea shows that love carries the gospel to other races and makes no demands with religious traditions.*

<sup>1</sup>The apostles and the believers throughout Judea heard that the Gentiles also had received the word of God. <sup>2</sup>So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcised believers criticized him <sup>3</sup>and said, "You went into the house of uncircumcised men and ate with them."

<sup>4</sup>Starting from the beginning, Peter told them the whole story: <sup>5</sup>"I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision. I saw something like a large sheet being let down from heaven by its four corners, and it came down to where I was. <sup>6</sup>I looked

These six brothers also went with me, and we entered the man's house. <sup>13</sup>He told us how he had seen an angel appear in his house and say, 'Send to Joppa for Simon who is called Peter. <sup>14</sup>He will bring you a message through which you and all your household will be saved.'

<sup>15</sup>"As I began to speak, the Holy Spirit came on them as he had come on us at the beginning. <sup>16</sup>Then I remembered what the Lord had said: 'John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.' <sup>17</sup>So if God gave them the same gift he gave us who believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I to think that I could stand in God's way?"

shall see face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I am fully known.

- 1. Did You Know?** 2022 marks the 160th anniversary of our St. Paul's congregation! In commemoration of this memorable milestone for our church, we will be sharing interesting facts about our church's history in each week's bulletin until a special anniversary service in fall. In 1865, the land on the corner of Hwy 32 & Playbird Rd was donated to the church. In 1884, a new building, 36 ft x 56 ft was built next to the old cemetery to replace the original structure. The total cost to build was around \$4,000. The foundation was made of stone, and everyone possessing a team of horses was asked to furnish two loads of stone for its construction. The building was built of brick, windows were arched, and a new pipe organ and bell were installed.
- 2. Joint Ascension Service** - On May 26 at 6:30 pm, there will be a joint Ascension service for St. Paul's (Howards Grove), Calvary (Sheboygan), and St. John's / St. Peter's (Cleveland). The service will be hosted by SJSP in Cleveland (1251 W. Washington Ave). **Children from the Sunday Schools and Day School will be singing an anthem and will meet at SJSP at 6:00 to put the song together.** The offering gathered at the service will go toward a mission project. All are welcome to stay after the service for ice cream and fellowship.
- 3. SAVE THE DATE** - St. Paul's will celebrate its 160th anniversary on September 18th in both Sunday services. We have lined up Rev. Tom Unke (our former pastor) to preach that day. More details to come!
- 4. Sunday Bible Study** - *finishes* our study on the roles of men and women in us in the gymnasium. We are looking at how this applies to Christians as we live in the world. Join s at 9:15am.
- 5. New Sunday Bible Study** - Beginning May 22 after the Call meeting, we will have a new Sunday morning Bible study entitled "The Seven Letters to the Seven Churches". In the book of Revelation, John received messages from God for seven churches that existed in his day. These were real churches, each facing challenges that threatened their existence and effectiveness. The focus of this study is to understand each church's context of ministry, the challenges faced by that church, and the instructions given to that church. We will be challenged to look for ways the lessons learned from these churches can be applied to St. Paul's.
- 6. # MLHS ANNOUNCEMENTS

1. **Big News: THE MATCH is Still On!** The MLHS building project continues to move forward and the board of control continues to consider how best to proceed in light of the current increase in costs.
