

Pastor's Message

⁹ I, John, your brother and companion in the suffering and kingdom and patient endurance that are ours in Jesus, was on the island of Patmos because of the word of God and the testimony of Jesus. ¹⁰ On the Lord's Day I was in the Spirit, and I heard behind me a loud voice like a trumpet, ¹¹ which said: "Write on a scroll what you see and send it to the seven churches: to Ephesus, Smyrna, Pergamum, Thyatira, Sardis, Philadelphia and Laodicea."



For the past semester we've been studying on Sunday morning the last book of the Bible, Revelation. It's a thrilling book that spans the spectrum of human emotions - all while feeding our faith. God warns his people about a horrible dragon and terrible beasts that will persecute his people until the end of time. He shows wonders in the heavens as we visually stand in awe at the countless numbers and great assembly of people gathered for his eternal praise. They have overcome all this by the blood of the Lamb. There is no doubt! Christ saves his bride, the church, and ushers in the eternal kingdom with her.

And we'd never know these things unless John wrote them down. And he never would have jotted these things down unless Jesus in verse eleven above commanded him to write.

The Revelation is not only a book *about* Jesus. It's a book *by* Jesus. These are his Sunday morning [Lord's Day] words spoon fed to John for your spiritual edification. These visions are given for you to consider his total authority and rule over everything seen and unseen, even as this world rejects him. [A famous female soccer star recently said her career ending Achilles tear proved there is no god.]

Keep in mind that John, your brother, had to see all of his fellow apostles lose their lives before him. He was in exile on the island of Patmos because the Romans didn't want him to die, they wanted him to suffer. They wouldn't give him the honor of becoming a martyr. The longest living apostle and leader of the early Christian church was suffering: persecution, struggles of old age, and separation from God's people.

And here he is on Sunday worshipping the Lord. His old age didn't cause him to turn against the Lord. It was reason all the more to turn toward him. And the letters he wrote and sent to the churches were to be *read* to them, again, likely on Sunday (or at worship). Our companion in suffering stuck on an island was still leading God's people to hear about Jesus, the one who overcame his suffering. He wanted us to read the word and receive encouragement from it – because we're also in the thick of it. He wanted us to recognize our personal and congregational sins and repent for them. Jesus from his heavenly throne still forgives our sins and causes our lamp to stay lit.

After all, it's his word. It's true. And whether it's the crown of life, eating the heavenly manna, eating from the tree of life, receiving a new name, eating with Jesus in heaven, or dressed in the heavenly clothes and having your name in the book of life – what he promises he will fulfill. He told John to write them to you. And he will do it.
