During this very exciting time we are looking to hire aides to work with our youngest lambs: 3K, 4K and Kindergarten students. Shifts are available between 6:30 AM-5:30 PM, Monday-Friday when school is in session. Positions include: providing before/after school care, assisting with classroom routines, lunch prep and recess and nap time supervision. - 7. Care Committee for Called Workers (CCCW) put out boxes in the narthex to help our four new teaching staff members. One box is for Scrip cards, gift cards, or money. - 8. **2023 WELS Convention:** From July 31-August 3, the WELS Biennial Convention was held in Saginaw, MI. Pastor Mueller was a delegate. Each week, we are sharing some highlights of the convention and updates on our church body's work:
 - a. "The Word For all, to all, by all." This is a theme in our World Mission work. The Lutheran Women's Mission Society kicked off the convention with a presentation of flags representing mission partners from 45 countries and prospective mission fields in 18 countries. The WELS helps, supports, and trains 500-plus national pastors who serve more than 1,000 churches and preaching stations around the world. With growing opportunities in Kenya, Vietnam, and Tanzania as well as the Academia Cristo / TELL online ministry, by 2035 WELS' worldwide fellowship could number more than 750,000 people.
 - b. Missionary Matthew Birner reported on the work being done in Latin America through Academia Cristo, a program which shares the message of God's grace with as many people as possible, identifies and trains potential leaders, and encourages these leaders to make more disciples who plant churches. Currently 25 church planter groups and 50 student-leaders are working through the program.
 - c. Missionary Luke Wolfgramm, the WELS Europe Team leader, highlighted ministry in Europe. Immigrants are pouring into London, one of the newest WELS mission fields where two missionaries work with a dedicated core group.
 - d. Missionary Guy Marquardt related the amazing opportunities to share the love of Jesus in a continent that contains 4.6 billion people, 60 percent of the world's population. Work is concentrated on exploring new outreach opportunities, training future workers, and supporting

- partner churches.
- e. The WELS declared fellowship with Obadiah Lutheran Synod of Uganda. Obadiah Lutheran Synod first came into contact with the WELS in late 2017. It currently has 28 congregations, 9 preaching stations, and more than 5,000 baptized members.

Pastor Isaiah Horn will be installed at Trinity (387 Cemetery Rd.) on September 10 at 1:00 p.m. Following the service, there will be a light reception.
- 11. **The MLHS "Sweet Corn Fest"** is coming soon. The corn will be picked and ready for our congregation sometime August 27th. So we know how much corn to pick, there is a sign-up sheet in the member room to place your order. To date, the MLHS Academic Voucher Committee has awarded 1867 vouchers to students in grades 5-8 that participate in the MLHS Academic Fair. Each voucher is worth \$200 of tuition to Manitowoc Lutheran High School. This program has been around for 15 years and much of the money raised has been through the "Sweet Corn Fest" each summer. Thanks for your support in the past and we hope you make plans to participate in this great program.
