# FAMILIES WITH SMALL CHILDREN



St. Paul's Lutheran Church is a member of the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (The WELS) and was founded in 1862. We have our Lutheran elementary school (4K-grade 8) on site and are part of a federation of churches to support our own high school, Manitowoc Lutheran High School.

**Worship Focus:** Who exactly is Jesus? Some think he is just an old story. Others say he was a loving influence and a good person. Still others claim he was merely one prophet among many. FIRST LESSON Exodus 34:5–9

The LORD proclaimed his compassionate, gracious, and forgiving name to Moses.

<sup>5</sup>Then the LORD came down in the cloud and stood there with him and proclaimed his name, the LORD. <sup>6</sup>And he passed in front of Moses, proclaiming, "The LORD, the LORD, the compassionate and gracious God, slow to anger, abounding in love and faithfulness, <sup>7</sup>maintaining love to thousands, and forgiving wickedness, rebellion and sin. Yet he does not leave the guilty unpunished; he punishes the children and their children for the sin of the parents to the third and fourth generation."

**SECOND LESSON** Romans 10:5–13

Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved by a righteousness that comes by faith, not the law.

<sup>5</sup>Moses writes this about the righteousness that is by the law: "The person who does these things will live by them." <sup>6</sup>But the righteousness that is by faith says: "Do not say in your heart, 'Who will ascend into heaven?'" (that is, to bring Christ down) <sup>7</sup>"or 'Who will descend into the deep?'" (that is, to bring Christ up from the dead). <sup>8</sup>But what does it say? "The word is near you; it is in your mouth and in your heart," that is, the message concerning faith that we proclaim: <sup>9</sup>If you declare with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. <sup>10</sup>For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you profess your faith and are saved. <sup>11</sup>As Scripture says, "Anyone who believes in him will never be put to shame." <sup>12</sup>For there is no difference between Jew and

Gentile—the same Lord is Lord of all and richly blesses all who call on him, <sup>13</sup>for, "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."





We believe in one holy Christian and apostolic Church.


We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

- 7. **2023 WELS Convention:** From July 31-August 3, the WELS Biennial Convention was held in Saginaw, MI. Pastor Mueller was a delegate. Each week, we are sharing some highlights of the convention and updates on our church body's work:
  - a. Our WELS Home Missions continues with the 100 missions in 10 years initiative. Rev. Mark Gabb, chairman for our Home Missions

- Board, spoke about the Great Commission that Christ has given us to go and make disciples, while faithfully and wisely using the resources he has given us for both outreach and nurture. "It comes down to reaching the lost," Gabb continued. "It's still about one Savior, one mission, one synod, one soul at a time."
- b. Rev. Jonathan Hein, coordinator of WELS Congregational Services, offered convention delegates a picture of the current state of the WELS and opportunities for the future. Amid concerns of aging congregations and pastoral vacancies, he noted, "This is not a time for us to cower or shake over the number of losses. It's a time to stand up and ask God to give us courage and strength and to love our community rather than lambast our community for becoming post-Christian. Let's love our community and bring Christ to them. Now is the time for us to do it.
- c. Rev. Phil Hirsch, who serves at Hope in Manhattan, KS delivered the convention essay, based on the theme: Embrace the Cross, Anticipate the Crown. "In the freedom of the gospel, we are NOT to let ourselves be burdened by a yoke of slavery again, but should embrace the cross of Christ and embrace whatever comes our way from the hand of our heavenly Father, confident that we have an eternal crown because of Christ and sure that, even now, all things serve us for good."
- 8. **New Pastor Installation:** We rejoice with our WELS brothers and sisters at Trinity in Kiel, that the Lord has sent them a second pastor to serve their growing ministry. Pastor Isaiah Horn will be installed at Trinity (387 Cemetery Rd.) on September 10 at 1:00 p.m. Following the service, there will be a light reception.
- 9. **The MLHS "Sweet Corn Fest"** is coming soon. The corn will be picked and ready for our congregation sometime August 27<sup>th</sup>. So we know how much corn to pick, there is a sign-up sheet in the member room to place your order. To date, the MLHS Academic Voucher Committee has awarded 1867 vouchers to students in grades 5-8 that participate in the MLHS Academic Fair. Each voucher is worth \$200 of tuition to Manitowoc Lutheran High School. This program has been around for 15 years and much of the money raised has been through the "Sweet Corn Fest" each summer. Thanks for your support in the past and we hope you make plans to participate in this great program. We will need 4 to 6 of our St. Paul's members to help with

- 10. **Some have been asking** if we are making the Garden Gym or other [non classroom] rooms in the addition available for member use.
