### General Fund

- Funds both church and school needs, supports faculty and staff
- Added 4K teacher & pastor recently, began evangelism mailers this year
- Supports ongoing ministry
- Maintains facilities

### Debt Retirement

- Bank loan stands around \$635,000
- Retiring this debt would free around \$6100 a month for ministry

### Faith to the Future

- Helps congregational students at WELS high schools
- Supports congregational Martin Luther College students (training for pastor or teacher)
- Supports congregational Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary students (final training for pastor)

### Member Assistance Fund

- Helps our congregational members in challenging financial times
- Was created to keep situations private as possible and avoid asking the congregation each time an occurrence happened
