

Christian early childhood ministries foster the development of the whole child. Young children are holistic learners. Motor skill learning, social learning, intellectual learning, emotional learning, and learning spiritual truths are interrelated.

Young children learn through play. Programs involve children as active learners by providing play experiences. Play enables children to pass through the stages of development by interacting with activities that are concrete, real, and relevant to their lives.

Christian early childhood ministries should provide an environment that is safe and secure, and that is arranged and equipped to meet the needs of the age group. The quality of the physical environment can help or hinder the learning process.





St. Paul's Early Childhood Curriculum Indoor Early Childhood Gymnasium

Early Childhood Gymnasium is an extension of our classroom and curriculum.

- Physical play activity is essential for child development.
- Children's motivation to play and move is high when play areas offer activities that respond to their movements, such as swings, spinning equipment, and spring equipment.
- Social and creative play motivation is high in play areas that offer well-crafted play experiences, such as sheltered and themed play areas.
- Play is not merely a pastime of children it is a complex behavior that promotes key areas of child development including sensorimotor skills, cognitive skills, social skills, and language. Although children themselves are adept at instigating play, adults can increase the developmental value of children's play by providing children with access to high quality play environments.




